## Have you ever wondered how to get in contact with a clinical trial?

ResearchMatch's "Send My Information" tool allows you to ask ResearchMatch to share your email and/or phone number with a study team. Simply visit <u>Trials Today</u> to search the thousands of clinical trials that are recruiting participants across the U.S., and follow the steps below:

- 1. Using <u>Trials Today</u>, find a clinical trial that is of interest to you.
- 2. Click on the trial to learn more.
- 3. Click the "Send my information" button on the top right, and follow the instructions outlined on that page. You'll be asked to sign into your ResearchMatch account and select a study location if there are multiple sites.
- 4. Next, select your contact information (email and/or phone number) and confirm that you would like your information shared with the study team.
- 5. If the study team is looking for study participants, ResearchMatch will share your information with them. You will then receive an email if your information is shared.
- 6. Wait to hear back from the study team to learn more about participating.
